First Minister Mark Drakeford has announced a set of new targeted restrictions for the hospitality and leisure sectors as well as a £340m package of support.

First Minister announces latest travel restrictions to stop coronavirus

First Minister Mark Drakeford has confirmed that travel between Wales and areas of high UK coronavirus rates will not be permitted from 6pm tomorrow for Friday 4 December.

Introduce regular rapid COVID testing for frontline health and social care staff in Wales

Health Minister Vaughan Gething has announced that asymptomatic frontline health and social care staff in Wales will be tested regularly. The tests will be introduced this month.

Roll out virtual group clinics across NHS Wales

Health Minister Vaughan Gething has announced that virtual group clinics across the National Health Service (NHS) Wales will be expanded to include virtual group consultations, or virtual group clinics, for outpatients across primary, secondary and community care services.

New guidelines for Hospital visits during the Coronavirus pandemic

New revised guidance for visits to NHS Wales hospitals will be issued on Monday 30 November 2020. These replace the guidance previously issued.

New campaign urges people to 'make sure you know about your employment rights and responsibilities'

With COVID-19 as its backdrop, Hannah Blythyn, Deputy Minister for Housing and Local Government, announced a new campaign to strengthen people's understanding of rights and responsibilities in the workplace.

Introduction of mass testing in the Lower Cynon Valley

Everyone living or working in the Lower Cynon Valley will be offered a coronavirus test. This will be the second area in Wales to introduce mass testing, following Merthyr Tydfil.

The app will help us understand the symptoms and spread of COVID-19. By answering some quick questions, you can help us plan our response to coronavirus.

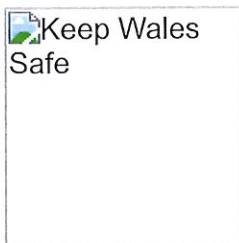
We will not share your answers beyond the NHS and trusted organisations that work directly with the NHS to respond to the coronavirus.

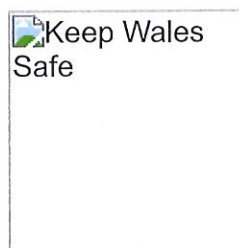

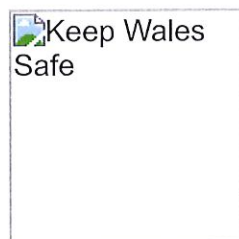

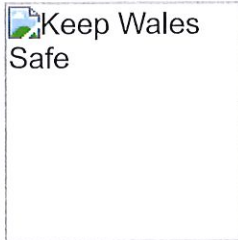
