[First Minister confirms moves to gradually move to alert level 1](#)

Up to 30 people can meet outdoors today (Friday 4 June) and that major outdoor activities can take place from Monday, as Wales moves to alert level 1.

[Portugal moves to orange on international travel traffic light list](#)

Travellers returning to Wales from Portugal will need to self-isolate after coming back after the Welsh Government confirmed that the popular holiday destination will move to the orange list from 04:00 hours on Tuesday 8 June.

Continue to track contacts in Wales until March 2022

Wales' successful Test, Trace, Protect service, which has helped reduce the spread of coronavirus, will continue until next year, thanks to additional funding from the Welsh Government.

Investing more than £25 million in diagnostic equipment for NHS Wales

More than £25 million is being invested in new imaging equipment to ensure that the NHS in Wales has access to the latest technology to help diagnose and treat earlier cancer and other diseases.

Test, Trace, Protect is the Welsh Government's strategy for testing the public and tracking the spread of coronavirus in Wales. There are ongoing Test, Trace, Protect communications to let people know about symptoms, test, self-isolate, contact tracing, self-isolation support and the NHS COVID-19 app. The latest posters, explanation documents and multilingual assets are available here

New videos and social media assets are also regularly produced for stakeholders to share through their own channels. The assets are available to download here - spread these to your networks and use them across your internal and external channels to help share information about Test, Trace, Protect.

NHS COVID-19 App

Do you use the NHS COVID-19 app? The app allows you to report symptoms, order a coronavirus test, and register at locations by scanning a QR code. The app does this while protecting your anonymity. If you have already downloaded the app, remember to use it - the more people use the app, the greater our chances of reducing the spread of the virus. The app is an important part of our Test, Trace, Protect program.

Self-isolation support scheme

If the NHS COVID-19 app has notified you to self-isolate, you can now apply via the app for £ payment of £500 as part of the self-isolation support scheme to help with loss of earnings.

COVID Symptom Study

Help us fight coronavirus by reporting your health on a daily basis, even if you are feeling ok.

You can help the NHS in the fight against coronavirus by completing a daily health survey on the [COVID Symptom Study app](#). This app is suitable for everyone, not just for the individuals with symptoms.

The app will help us understand the symptoms and spread of COVID-19. By answering some quick questions, you can help us plan our response to coronavirus.

We will not share your answers beyond the NHS and trusted organisations working directly with the NHS to respond to coronavirus.
